

RESPECT YOUR GREENKEEPER... AND YOUR COURSE



Golf courses are generally at their busiest in the summer months - but it's also a hugely busy time for greenkeepers. Please respect them and their well-being as they work on the course.

- A golf course is unique in sport, as greenkeepers carry out work while the course is in play.
- A golfer should wait until the way ahead is clear before playing a shot - this applies whether the person ahead is a greenkeeper, another golfer or a member of the public.
- Golfers have a duty of care not to put others at risk as a result of their actions.
- This is all covered in the "Etiquette: Behaviour On The Course" section of the Rules Of Golf.
- Also, don't forget about the welfare of the course as you play. Please repair pitchmarks, rake bunkers carefully and replace divots.
